That pursuant to section 6-c of the General Municipal Law there is hereby established a specific capital reserve fund in the amount of One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00) to accumulate all or part of the cost of the reconstruction of the sewer main and pump station of the Keuka Park Sewer District (the "District").
- SECTION 2. That this fund is to be known as the "Sewer Main and Pump Station Reserve Fund of the Keuka Park Sewer District."
- SECTION 3. That the estimated maximum cost of such reconstruction is One Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000.00).
- SECTION 5. That such sums as may hereafter be appropriated shall become part of the fund.
- SECTION 6. That the moneys in the fund shall be deposited in a separate bank account in Five Star Bank, Penn Yan office or such other bank as may be designated by Resolution of this Board from time to time.
- SECTION 7. That the Supervisor is authorized to invest, from time to time, the moneys of this fund pursuant to Section 10 of the General Municipal Law. Any interest earned or capital gains realized on the moneys so deposited or invested shall accrue to and become a part of the fund.
- SECTION 8. That no expenditure shall be made from the fund except by authorization of the Town Board of the Town of Jerusalem pursuant to the provisions of section 6-c of the General Municipal Law.
- SECTION 9. That this resolution is subject to permissive referendum, but the resolution to expend moneys from the fund will not be subject to permissive referendum under Section 6-c of the General Municipal Law.

SECTION 10. That this resolution shall take effect immediately.

CONSENT OF JERUSALEM TOWN BOARD - Application of Harbor View Townhomes LLC, et al the Owners of the Land on Both Sides of a Highway in the Town of Jerusalem, Yates County, New York, Known as Mill Street, for the Alteration of the Limits of Said Highway that Runs Through the Land of Said Owners, Pursuant to Section 172 of the Highway Law

The undersigned, being all of the members of the Town Board of the Town of Jerusalem, having read the Petition of Harbor View Townhomes LLC, et al for the alteration of the boundaries of Mill Street in said Town and having been fully advised with respect

to the facts surrounding this application, do hereby

CONSENT, in accordance with the provisions of section 172 of the Highway Law of the State of New York that the Highway Superintendent of the Town of Jerusalem make an order altering the boundary of the highway known as Mill Street in the Town of Jerusalem, Yates County, New York.

## MILL STREET/TOWNHOUSE PROJECT:

The following commitments were made by David Wegman and George Sproule, on behalf of their company, Harbor View Townhomes, LLC, to the Town of Jerusalem.

Mill Street: Upon construction of the Harbor View Townhome Project, Mr. Wegman and Mr. Sproule will assume responsibility for snow plowing of Mill Street from Route 54A to its easterly terminus. This obligation may be assigned to the Harbor View Homeowners Association which will be formed in conjunction with the project.

Mr. Wegman and Mr. Sproule, at their expense, will relocate the waterline which now runs north of Mill Street to a location within the revised right-of-way.

During construction of the townhome project, they will re-pave Mill Street for its entire length from Route 54A at the west to its easterly terminus. The entire paved area will be within the right-of-way as revised. "Pavement" shall consist of tar and stone.

Deed Restrictions: The Harbor View Townhome Project will be constructed on an assemblage of land consisting of a parcel now owned by Harbor View Townhomes LLC, a portion of a lot now owned by Nangeo (George Sproule) and a portion of parcel now owned by Lake Keuka Boat Company LLC (Wegman). The portions of the Nangeo parcel and Lake Keuka Boat Company parcel which are not conveyed to Harbor View will be deed restricted to prohibit the construction of any buildings on the site other than a clubhouse building, 18x20 utility building (which is shown on the site plan submitted to the planning board), and dock facilities along the waterfront of the Nangeo parcel, and the possibility of garages on the Lake Keuka Board Company parcel for the sole use by owners of units in the townhouse project.

Resident Canoe Kayak parking: Several parking places are being reserved on the former "Mahoney" property for use by town residents, by permit only, while canoeing or kayaking on Keuka Lake.

Whereas, our Founding Fathers, in order to secure the blessings of liberty for themselves and their posterity, did ordain and establish a Constitution for the United States of America; and

Whereas, it is of the greatest importance that all citizens fully understand the provisions and principles contained in the Constitution in order to effectively support, preserve and defend it against all enemies; and

Whereas, the two hundred and twenty second anniversary of the signing of the Constitution provides an historic opportunity for all Americans to remember the achievements of the Framers of the Constitution and the rights, privileges, and responsibilities they afforded us in this unique document; and

Whereas, the independence guaranteed to American citizens, whether by birth or naturalization, should be celebrated by appropriate ceremonies and activities during Constitution Week, September 16 through 22, as designated by proclamation of the President of the United States of America in accordance with Public Law 915; now

Therefore, I Daryl H. ## HISTORIAN PRESENTATION

Town Historian Bob Evans presented a plaque containing a sign believed to be from a bridge in the early 1900's that was found during a recent excavation. According to Town records, a great storm wiped out all of the bridges in November 1905. It was customary in those days to depict the name of the Highway Superintendent on the bridges and this particular sign says "E.E. Evans, Commissioner, 1905", who was the Historian's grandfather. The sign has been reconditioned for historical preservation and is on public display at the Town Hall.
